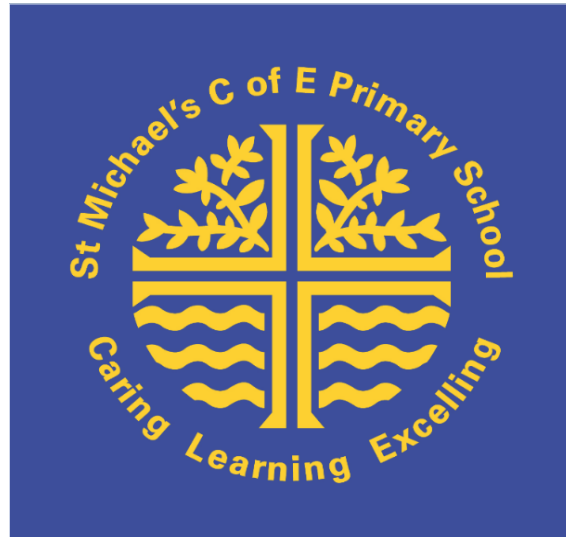




Equality Statement

In our inclusive and caring church school community our actions are mirrors of our Christian values.

The Equality Act 2010 provides a single, consolidated source of discrimination law. It simplifies the law and it extends protection from discrimination in some areas.

Our specific duties at St Michael's C of E Primary School are to promote the awareness of equality.

It is unlawful for a school to discriminate against a pupil, prospective pupil, or member/prospective member of staff, by treating them less favourably because of their:

- age
- disability
- gender reassignment
- marriage and civil partnership
- pregnancy and maternity
- race
- religion or belief
- sex
- sexual orientation

These are known as the 9 Protective Characteristics.

Our objectives for the Academic Year of 2025/26 are:

- To promote spiritual, moral, social and cultural development through all appropriate curricular opportunities, with particular reference to issues of equality and diversity.
- To reduce prejudice and increase understanding of equality through direct teaching across the curriculum.
