The Colour Monster by Anna Llenas

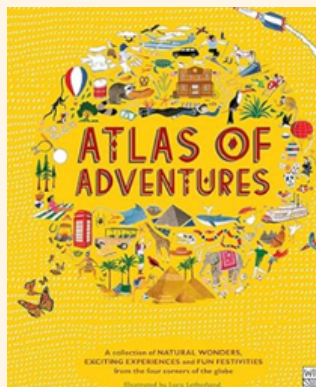
